Our home time arrangements

As part of our Risk Assessment there are a number of things which are different this year at home time.

- Only year 6 can walk home on their own. The children are escorted by a member of staff
 at 3.15pm so we know they have left safely. We do not have the capacity to allow Y5
 pupils to safely leave school on their own.
- Older siblings are unable to walk through the school to meet an adult in the Infant playground. Again, with lots of adults on site, this can not be done safely.
- Parents / carers should collect their child from the classroom and not ask a friend to do
 this. We are not adhering to social distancing if parents are waiting outside the school
 whilst someone else collects their child.

Whilst we appreciate these arrangements are more time consuming, everything we are doing is to make sure our school is as safe as possible. With infection rates rising in London we all need to do our part. We ask that you continue to work with us. In the event of an emergency, please contact the school office by 2.30pm.

Homework



Please can we remind families about the importance of homework. Children are expected to complete their weekly homework tasks set by their teacher. As explained this week, all recorded work is via Google Classroom. This is to help children and families become more confident with our 'blended' learning approach which is a Government directive.

Please let your child's teacher know if you are experiencing problems turning your child's work in.



Helping with extra learning



Some parents have been asking how they can help support their child at home. As well as making sure they are doing their homework we would recommend the following:

- Extra reading reading together a variety of books.
- Talking talking in English about new vocabulary and finding out what new words mean.
- Handwriting & Punctuation making sure children understand when basic punctuation should be used.
- Spellings recapping previous spellings at home.
