

Ambitious and Creative me: Poets at work



Applications are due by 31st October – every child must have an application.


It's Good to Grow

Office Notices



Appointments

Parents should endeavour to make doctor/dentist appointments out of school hours, however, if this is not possible a copy of an appointment card must be shown at the office. We ask that parents do not pick up children from school for an appointment after 2.30pm as this can lead to distractions in their classrooms.

Absences

If your child is unwell, please contact the school office by 9.15am. You must contact the school every day of your child's absence. **School office 0208 952 6026**

From time to time, we know that children can be unwell with vomiting and diarrhoea. Please note that they should not return to school for **48 hours** after there last bout. We appreciate this is inconvenient, and you may not believe that your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we say this in **all** cases and it should reduce the risk of infection for all children in school.

If your child develops a new persistent cough or high fever or loss of taste or smell then they must have a PCR test or stay at home for 10 days from when they first developed symptoms. If your child is unwell and they need to stay at home, we are asking you to work with us and arrange for a PCR test. This is to ensure we are continuing to work together to keep our community safe.

We will require proof of a negative PCR before your child is able to come back to school.
