Update



You may have seen that I have returned to school this week. It has been so delightful seeing the children, staff and families. Thank you for all your well wishes.

We continue to monitor our Covid Risk Assessment regularly - we have had another positive case this week. Although we are not expected to, we will carry on informing our families if we have a positive case in the school so you can be more vigilant if your child becomes unwell and so that you understand if we ask you to take your child for a PCR test.

By maintaining this, we are reducing the spread of potential infection in our school.

We are also aware that a number of families would like to take an extended break over the Christmas holidays to travel abroad to see family members who you may not have seen for a long period. Whilst we are emphatic to this situation, Government guidance issued to all schools has made it very clear that school leaders should be promoting full attendance and 'enforcing this'. Please apply if you would like to take your child out of school during term time. Whilst we can only approve absence for exceptional circumstances, we also need to keep a record of requested and dates.

They had a great time and showed so much enthusiasm for the sport and great sportsmanship towards each other. Well done girls!




Creative Me - Electricity



Safeguarding

Appointments

From time to time, we know that children can be unwell with vomiting and diarrhoea. Please note that they should not return to school for **48 hours** after their last bout. We appreciate this is inconvenient, and you may not believe that your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we say this in **all** cases and it should reduce the risk of infection for all children in school.
